

100 YEARS OF RACING 2010 - 2020

2010 - After three campaigns, Ireland emerged victorious in the Rolex Commodores' Cup.

2011 – During the Rolex Fastnet Race, the canting keel detaches from Rambler 100 shortly after rounding the Fastnet Rock. The crew was rescued by the Baltimore lifeboat. Niklas Zennstrom's Rán secures victory under IRC for the second consecutive edition. New records were established for the race: Abu Dhabi Ocean Racing, sailed by Ian Walker, finished in 1 day, 18 hours, 35 minutes (Monohull). Banque Populaire V, sailed by Loick Peyron, finished in 1 day, 8 hours, 48 minutes (Multihull).

2012 – Brewin Dolphin became the title sponsor of the Commodores' Cup. The Rating Office was commissioned to oversee the development of the Volvo Ocean 65.

2013 - A record 337 starters registered for the Rolex Fastnet Race's IRC fleet within 24 hours. The first double-handed overall winner was JPK 10.10, Night and Day, sailed by father and son team, Pascal and Alexis Loison.

2014 - RORC merges with the Royal Corinthian Yacht Club in Cowes, offering the combined membership a clubhouse in Cowes as well as the headquarters in London. The inaugural RORC Transatlantic Race is conducted from Puerto Calero, Lanzarote, to Port Louis, Grenada.

2016 - A total of 11 regional and specialist GBR IRC Championships are held. The inaugural IRC European Championship takes place in Cork, Ireland.

2017 - The First 44.7 Lisa, owned by Nick and Suzi Jones, wins the RORC Season's Points Championship for two consecutive years (2016-17). RORC Commodore Michael Boyd serves as navigator.

2019 - A record 388 starters participate in the Rolex Fastnet Race.
